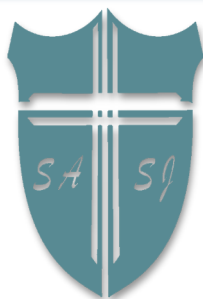

Plan for reopening the church the third weekend of August Saturday, August 15th and Sunday, August 16th

- We are excited to finally go back in the Church to celebrate the Mass. Due to the number of people that can be safely seated while maintaining appropriate social distancing, we will use the St. Anne location for most of the well-attended Masses to accommodate more people.
- To serve as many parishioners as possible during a weekend English Mass, the Parish Hall at St. Anne will be opened for as many as **60** additional parishioners. The mass will be live streamed onto the big screen. Eucharistic Ministers will be sent to the Parish Hall to distribute communion.
- The weekend mass schedule will be:
 - Saturday 5 p.m. – St. Anne**
 - Sunday 8 a.m. – St. Anne**
 - Sunday 10 a.m. – St. Anne**
 - Sunday 12 noon in Spanish – St. Jude**
 - Sunday 5 p.m. – St. Jude**
- Daily Mass will go back to normal times: **Monday - Wednesday 7 a.m. in the St Jude location; Thursday-Saturday 8:15 a.m. in the St. Anne location.**
- Prior to admittance into the masses, all parishioners and Liturgical Ministers will have their temperature taken by a Thermal Scan Thermometer. Any person with a temperature of above **98.6** will be advise that they may not attend mass.
- Parishioners will be required to wear a mask at all times.
- While inside the church, to observe social distancing as much as possible, we will use a reverse process for receiving communion. Parishioners will exit their pews to the side aisles approach the altar and then return to their seats from the center aisle.
- Couples and Families who live in the same household may sit together. Single parishioners are not encouraged to sit with non-family members.
- We will have a no-contact drop box for the offertory
- We will continue the use of the single use reading and songbook. Parishioners will pick these up from a no-contact table at the entrance of the church and throw them away upon leaving the mass.
- Bulletins will be made available by no-contact table as well.
- There will be trash bins placed outside of the church. Parishioners will be reminded to dispose of their own single use reading and song papers at the end of mass.
- Bathroom facilities are for emergency use only.
- Cry rooms at both locations are limited to one family only and should be reserved for a family with children.
- After every mass, a sanitizing mist will be used on all the hard and soft surfaces in the church.
- We will utilize as few volunteers as necessary to maintain proper social distancing for the parishioners attending mass.

This is the plan for reopening the church while we are observing **SOCIAL DISTANCING**.

We are Grateful for your continued understanding and patience.

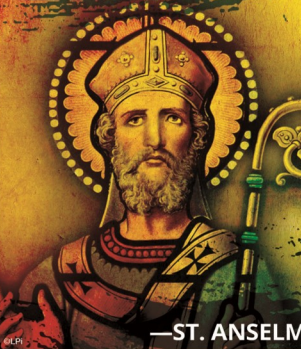

RESPONDING to the Call

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments Being Human is to Doubt

Humans doubt. It's what we do. We doubt ourselves and we doubt others.

Before any of us say anything about Peter's doubting the words of Jesus that told him he could get out of his boat and walk on water, we need to get real with ourselves: How would I respond in the same situation? I remember when I was child taking swimming lessons. One day I simply tightened up my muscles and sank. The lifeguard pulled me up and asked what happened. I said I did not know. The truth is that I was sinking under the weight of my own doubt. I did not believe I could do what clearly, I was told I could. That was only in five feet of water in a pool! Now that I'm older, I can look back and laugh. But an adult, the swimming pool is life, and I would be lying if I said that there are no longer times I find myself sinking due to new doubts.

Much of our doubt comes about because of a lack of trust in God. We place our trust in material things, wealth, or imperfect people instead of the One who is worthy of our trust 100 percent of the time. Our stewardship is often hampered by our doubt that God will provide all that we need. If I give more, I may not have enough to survive! When we place all our trust in God, not only do we find that we have been given all we need — our doubt that cause us to sink in the pool of life fades away. We don't suddenly become perfect in our trust, and there will be times when we find ourselves with concerns again. However, it is in those moments we find that He is still there, speaking the words we need to hear: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained: Marian Feasts

Question:

Why does Mary have so many feast days and names?

Answer:

Christians first began celebrating feast days in honor of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, in the fifth century. That celebration (originally called the Feast of the Dormition and now known by Roman Catholics as the Solemnity of the Assumption) was celebrated on August 15. Very soon, however, other special days dedicated to Mary began to appear in Jerusalem, Rome, and other major cities of the Christian world. These days of feasting became important parts of the life of the community. But, more importantly, each of these unique celebrations became an opportunity to focus on a different facet of the Christian faith, as believers focused their attention on specific events or mysteries of the lives of Mary and her Son.

Over the centuries, some of these celebrations became universal (such as the Assumption on August 15, the Immaculate Conception on December 8, and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God on January 1). Other celebrations were more closely tied to certain religious orders (such as the Carmelites celebration of "Our Lady of Mount Carmel" on July 16 or the Servite Friars feast of the "Seven Sorrows of Mary," which is now celebrated as the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15).

In more recent times, Marian apparitions (like Guadalupe, Lourdes, and Fatima) have inspired special liturgical celebrations. Pope Francis has added two new celebrations of Mary to the Church's calendar: The Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church (on the Monday after Pentecost) and the Commemoration of Our Lady of Loreto (on December 10). The various titles of Mary (like those we find in the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary) help us to reflect on different aspects of Mary's faith and the ways that the Holy Spirit is at work in her and through her, especially as the Mother of Jesus.

In the end, whatever the event or mystery being celebrated in a particular liturgy or the title of Mary being used, we are invited to always see Mary in connection with the saving work of her Son. She is, of course, a patroness and protector for every Christian, but she is also a model of discipleship and contemplation: "Having entered deeply into the history of salvation, Mary, in a way, unites in her person and re-echoes the most important doctrines of the faith: and when she is the subject of preaching and worship she prompts the faithful to come to her Son, to his sacrifice and to the love of the Father" (Lumen Gentium, 65).
