

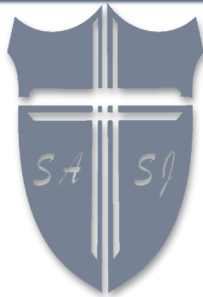

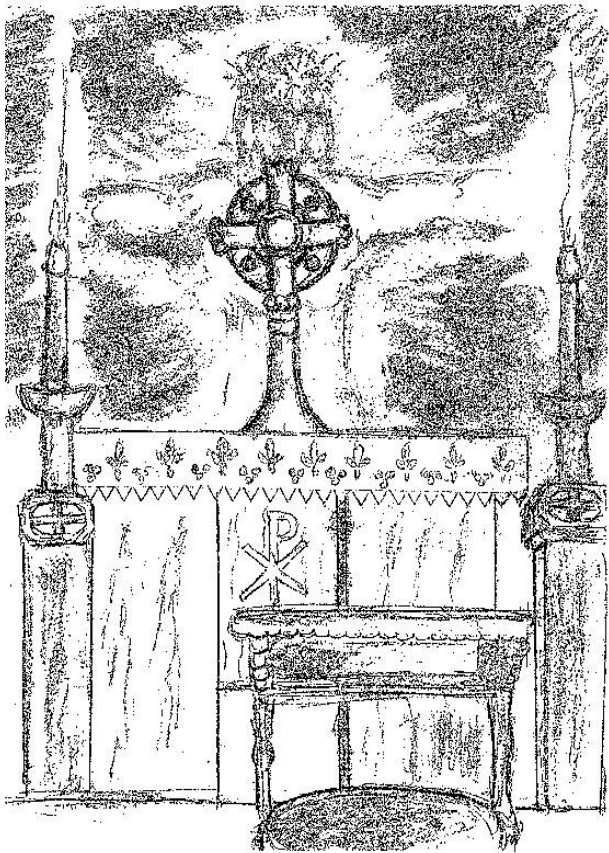

The late Councilman Louis Fleming and Mrs. Emma R. Fleming married at St. Jude Catholic Church in 1953. He was born in New York, NY and she in Wilmington, NC, yet their paths crossed some years later which led to their union and the birth of their six children. Moreover, their commitment to faith, family, and community was the core their values and servant leadership. Mr. Fleming, a retired Chief Warrant Officer 3 of the United States Army was heavily involved as a civil rights leader, humanitarian, advocate for veterans and their families, and politician. Mrs. Fleming is a retired educator who served in leadership roles with the American Legion, the SC Retired Education Association, and volunteered in various community organizations. Because she taught in underserved areas, Mrs. Fleming often visited with families and would provide materials to ensure her students had what they needed to be successful in their studies.

Mr. and Mrs. Fleming strongly believed in giving their time, talents and resources to the greater community and the church. Together, they engaged in voter registration efforts, served as poll managers, helped to form the East Red Bay Neighborhood Association, and active in their local NAACP chapter. They served as lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, ushers, and religious education instructors at St. Jude. The Flemings also participated in the Cursillo, were two of the founding members of the Diocesan Office of Black Ministry, and charter members of the St. Jude Court/Council Knights of Peter Claver and Ladies Auxiliary. Through their active volunteerism, they deeply understood the importance of contributing towards the enrichment of the Black experience in the Catholic church. In honoring Black History Month and highlighting service and leadership of Black families, it is an honor to share the journey of Mr. and Mrs. Fleming, who were purposed and intentional in giving selflessly to many causes to enhance the rights, access and resources particularly in the Catholic faith and the Sumter community at large.

THE AUDACITY OF HOLINESS

Do you know a holy person? I'm not talking about piety — that's important, too, in its own way. But right now, I'm speaking of holiness.

St. Therese of Lisieux called holiness “a disposition of the heart that makes us humble and little in the arms of God, aware of our weakness, and confident — in the most audacious way — in His Fatherly goodness.”

The holy person sees a storm on the horizon of life, and rather than give themselves over to fear and despair (natural and understandable reactions), regards the gathering winds as an opportunity to rely more fully on God. The holy person takes a bad situation and sanctifies it with charity and understanding that defies our fallen human nature.

Peter's mother-in-law was still in the throes of a fever when Jesus grasped her hand. It wasn't until she took his hand and allowed him to help her up that “the fever left her and she waited on them.” Before the fever could leave her, she had to commit to holiness — to put her trust in him in a most audacious way. She had to find it within herself to lift her weakened hand to grasp his — and as soon as she did, she was rewarded. Her bodily health restored, she gave thanks, and attended to his needs.

God's hand is always outstretched to us. Will we take it, even if the fever of sin and pride and worldly concerns rages in our souls? Will we muster the strength? Will we be audacious enough to have confidence in His Fatherly goodness?

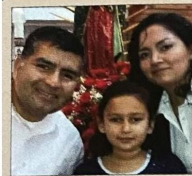


Heavenly Father, since the time of the Apostles you have inspired the Church to commission men to assist in a special way in the pastoral mission of Christ.

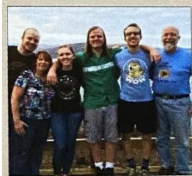
